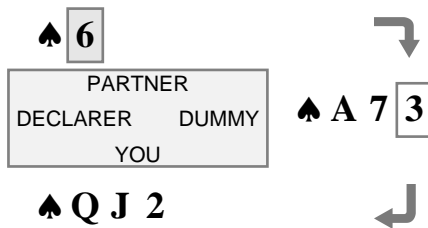

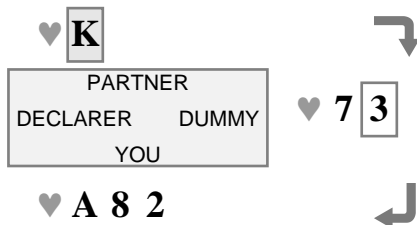
1. **Your partner led the ♠6 against 3NT.**

- What is your third hand play? Why?



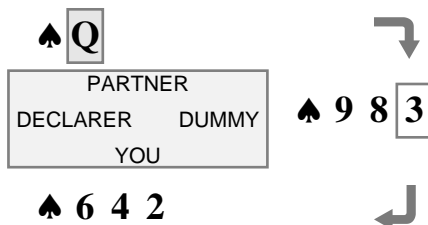
2. **Your partner led the ♥K against 2NT.**

- What is your play on the next heart lead?

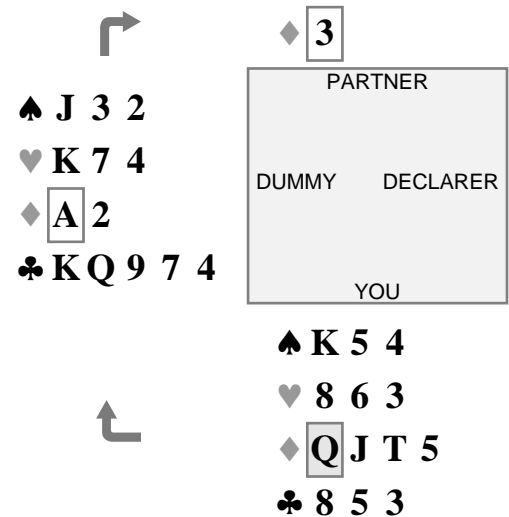


3. **Your partner led the ♠Q against 3NT.**

4. **The contract is 3NT.**

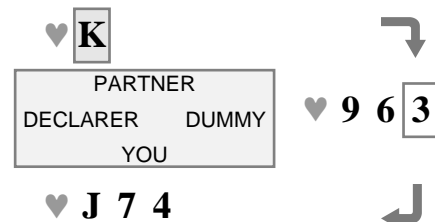


You lead the ♦Q, dummy played the ♦A, and your partner played the ♦3.

- After winning the first trick, declarer starts taking club tricks and partner discards the ♠6 on the third round. What does this say about partner's hand?

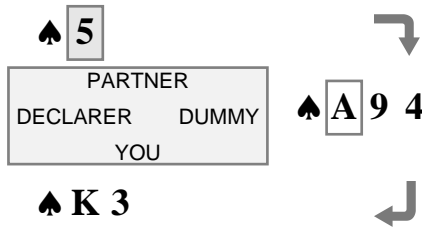
5. **Your partner led the ♥K against 3NT.**

- What is your third hand play? Why?



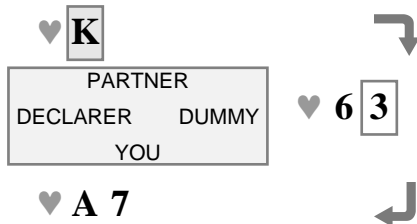
6. Your partner led the ♠5 against 3NT and dummy played the ♠A.

- What is your third hand play? Why?



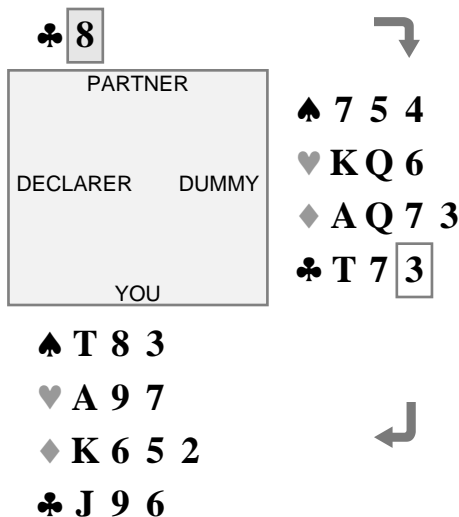
7. Your partner led the ♥K against 3NT.

- What should you lead when you take a trick with the ♥A or the ♦K?

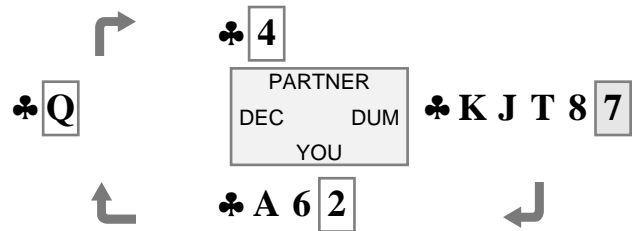


9. The contract is 3NT by West.



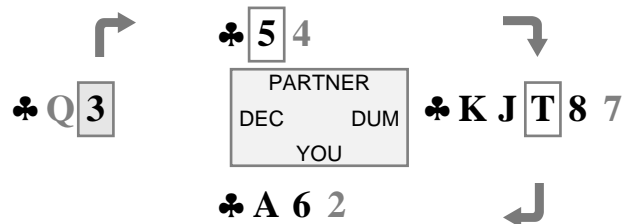
On the first trick, partner led the ♠J, dummy played the ♠K, you played the ♠4 and declarer played the ♠5.
